Domestic Violence: **It's Your Business.**

Partnerships with business sponsors that are aligned with our mission and are passionate about our cause have a powerful impact on women experiencing intimate partner violence.

The commitment of **Corporate Sponsors** enables us to continue to provide services and **meaningful programs** for free while growing our services to meet the **increased demand** that exists.

The CAMPBELL RIVER AND NORTH ISLAND TRANSITION SOCIETY (CRNITS) is a registered non-profit organization which has a mandate to end family violence.

The Society assists women who are fleeing abuse and seeking **emergency shelter** at the **Ann Elmore Transition House**, or at one of our **safe homes** in remote locations. Our **counselling services** benefit women who are overcoming trauma and other challenges, while our **residential recovery programs** address substance misuse issues. Women who are unsheltered or struggling through poverty benefit from our residential personal change program and from supportive resources and poverty relief available at our **drop-in centre**.

Receiving the appropriate services, safety and housing while having someone walk alongside is the catalyst for change for our clients! **Clients like Amanda** are given the opportunity to reach their full potential.

In her own words:

"Before moving in here I used to drink."

"My kids got taken away from me and they were taken away for a year and half. I got evicted the next day after my kids were taken."

There is hope!

"I had to go to treatment and figure out what I really wanted to do. When I came back, they had a place for me here at Rose Harbour"

"I am almost three years sober now. I am really inspired from all the work I have done on myself. The people who work here are amazing. They are really supportive and I truly love every single person who has helped me in my journey for sobriety

"I don't think I would be almost three years sober if I didn't live here with all the support that I have."

Do you know we have **unsheltered senior women** in our community? More than **60 per cent** of women accessing the drop-in centre are over 50 years old and are living in poverty, are homeless or at risk of homelessness. **Eagle Harbour** provides subsidized second stage housing and permanent housing, with a focus on senior women.

Domestic Violence affects us all! Do you know that it can carry over into the workplace? Canadian employers lose **\$77.9 million annually** because of the direct and indirect effects of Intimate partner violence.

Together, with your help, we will continue to educate, bring awareness and create action that empowers women to stop the generational cycle of abuse.
